Who are we?

Hunter Prelude is an early childhood intervention service. We work in partnership with families and others who work with children from birth – 8 years, with concerns about their growth and development.

What is the Inclusion Support Program?

At Hunter Prelude, we believe that all children have the same rights to learn and play in their community.

This program:

- Supports you and your child to be involved in everyday routines at home, community, your child's early education centre and school.
- Support you and your child through transitions to school and other educational settings



What support can the Inclusion Support Program provide?

We can:

- Meet with you to discuss your hopes and wishes for your child.
- With your permission, meet with others who work with your child to find out how we can work together to support your child play, learn, develop skills and interact with other children.
- Work with other people who work with your child to develop resources, strategies, provide consultation and training that may be required to facilitate the inclusion of your child.

How will this help my Child?

- We will do all we can to help your child play with other children, make friends, learn and develop their skills.
